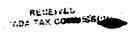

Mr. Ralph Denton, Attorney, and Mr. Gordon M. Plotke, President of G. & R. Enterprises, appeared before the Board in connection with the application of the corporation for a gambling license at the El Rancho Hotel in Wells. Mr. Denton made a general statement with respect to the application, the legal machinery involved, the financing, the proposed operation of the casino, and the background of the applicants. TOPAZ LODGE - GARDNERVILLE

Messrs. Phillip A. LaSorella, Harold R. Roberts, Walter Petersen, and Richard L. Fuller, accompanied by their attorney, Robert McDonald, appeared before the Board in behalf of

their application for a license at Topaz Lodge, Gardnerville. The finances of the operation were discussed and concern was expressed by the Board regarding the inadequacy of the available cash for opening costs. Mr. McDonald answered that he was authorized to state for the seller, Don French, that he would reduce the down payment by \$15,000 in order to make available more cash. A representation was also made that if necessary Mr. Roberts would, from his own funds, be able to increase his investment.

Following discussion by the Board, a motion was made by Mr. Gallagher that the application be approved contingent upon living up to the commitments and representations made before the Board, and, in addition, that the commitments of contributions to capital be fulfilled in accordance with what is filed here before this license is assued. Mr. Sinnott seconded the motion and it was passed.

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MINT CLUB - WINNEMUCCA

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MINUTES OF

NEVADA GAMING CONTROL BOARD

Thursday, February 13, 1958

The meeting was called to order at 2 p. m., in the office of the Gaming Control Board, with the following members present:

ROYAL NEVADA HOTEL (SAM BAKER, T. W. RICHARDSON, EDWARD CHANDLER) - LAS VEGAS

Hotel President T. W. Richardson and his attorney, Thomas Foley, appeared before the Board in behalf of the reinstatement of the Royal Nevada's license. There was a discussion concerning the financing of the hotel and the Board was informed that the hotel now had about the \$300,000 required by the Board to finance the resumption of gambling. The Board, however, indicated it wished to further investigate a proposed \$48,000 loan included in the figure.

Mr. Foley read a letter in which it was pointed out Mr. Sam Baker would obtain an 11% interest for a \$49,500 loan to the casino and would become general manager.

Mr. Richardson said Maurice H. Friedman had resigned and sold his interest in the hotel to him and would have no voice whatever in future operation of the Royal Nevada. He also said that other former employees objectionable to the Board would have no part in the future operation.

The Board also was told creditors of the hotel were in favor of resumption of operation and had agreed to an orderly payment of debts owed by the Royal Nevada.
